I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken:

I MAY BE:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league or CFA Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents.

IN ADDITION:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club.

CSFC History



In the summer of 1959 Cliff Phelps decided it was time football association was brought back to the town. It had been six long years since the boys of the town had donned the Blue & White of Sodbury in the Western League. After several meetings at The Bell Inn (Now Brooks Bar & Kitchen) the new club was formed. Major L.M.Harris was President, Mr. E Purbrick Chairman, Mr. C Phelps Vice Chairman, Club Captain Dennis Greenaway and Youth Captain Michael Boulton. In the initial 1959/60 season they entered a senior team into The Dursley & Wotton League and a team into the Youth Section. The following season Sodbury joined the Bristol and District League and throughout the 60's remained in Division 3.

The 1970's began with relegation, when we finished bottom of Division 3 and the slump continued in 1971/72 Season when finishing bottom of Division 4. The Mid 70's saw a few changes and the ground work of the team today. Mike Fox became player Manager and 'The Sods' began a Sunday Side. In the 1976/77 Season, Sodbury finished third in Division 5 and gained promotion. The 1978/79 Season saw us go one better and finished runners-up of Division 4. To finish the decade off and celebrate twenty years of the club's rebirth, we won the Championship of Division 3 in 1979/80.

The 1980's began were the 70's left off and a fourth place finish gave Sodbury promotion to Bristol and District Division 1. 1981/82 saw the rebirth of our Reserve side and by the end of the season, the 1st's had gained promotion to the Senior Division. From Division 5, to the Senior League in six seasons. The first season in the Senior division was mid-table finish and the end of the season saw Mike Fox's testimonial and an Ashton Gate appearance against Mangotsfield united. The following season we finished third. After finishing 15th in 1985/86 we were relegated to Division 1, where we remained until finishing runners up in 1988/89.

The 1990's kicked off with a third place finish and promotion to the Bristol Premier Combination Div 1. in 1990/91. The early 90's saw a new clubhouse and changing rooms built with Players and Committee members contributing their trades. A fourth place finish and the winning of the Premier cup in 1992/93 was the clubs best season so far. The Sods remained in Division 1 until the end of the nineties, when they were promoted to the Premier Division for the 1999/00 Season.

The 2000's and after 3 seasons in the Premier, the Sods were relegated at the end of 2001/02 season. A new manager and new era began in 2002/03. Les Underdown and his Assistant Jeff Clark both ex-players with the club took over the reins. A mid table finish in their first season, saw Les leave and left Jeff in the hot seat. The following season saw another mid-table

finish and the Reserves become Champions with the exciting players now in the squad. 2004/05 ended in a disappointing third place but the club now had a third team as well. The following season, the previous year was forgotten when the club won the Championship and promoted back to the Premier division.

A mid table finish in the Premier division and the other 2 teams both winning promotion was a good season in 2006/07. 2007/08 became the clubs most successful season, when the first's won the Championship of the Premier and the reserves Champions of Bristol & District division 1. The first season and a change of manager in the Gloucestershire county league and the team finished bottom of the league, only winning 5 games. Even though the club finished bottom, they were not relegated. Mark Stenner was appointed manager and he started the steady march up the County league.

The 2010's has produced the club's most successful time in their history. Mark Stenner had taken the team to a third place finish in the County league in 2010/11. After his departure early the following season, Scott Gibson took over. A disappointing bottom place finish was followed by two seasons of rebuilding and climbing the league. Karl Reese was appointed new manager at the beginning of 2014/15 season and in his first season had promoted the club from the County league to the dizzy heights of Western League football with a third place finish. Not a bad start for the new gaffer but with some new faces and playing great football, we went 1 better the following season and won the Western League Division 1 Championship. 2016/17 and the Western League Premier division was tough but a very creditable 13th position and competing in the F.A.Vase was our most successful season so far.

2017/18 was going to be a massive mountain to climb. Karl had left the club and also half the first team had departed to pastures new. Enter Neil Simons our new gaffer, a season in the Western league to take on with half a team and to make things a little more difficult, your first game is the clubs first ever game in the F.A.Cup. The season ended with a 13th place finish, an FA Cup victory and a quarter final place in the GFA Challenge trophy.

Early in the 2018/19 Season Neil decided to leave the club and shortly afterwards we appointed our present manager Joe White and his assistant Steve. At the end of the season under his leadership, the club had finished 10th in the Western League and had the best run in the FA cup in the clubs history. The club were successful in their appeal against the Hellenic League, sideways move by the F.A. So 2019/20 season was in the Western League Premier. The uncertainty of which League we would be playing in unsettled the players and so several departed the Club before a ball was kicked that Season. Three weeks before the season started the club also lost our Manager and his Assistant. Justin Bishop & Scott Gibson took control of the 1st team as Caretaker management and remained there until the League came to an abrupt halt. The F.A. announced on 26th March 2020 that the Step 1-7 game and all grassroots football leagues and competition under its umbrella had ended,

as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic. All results for the season would be expunged.

The 2020's began with Jeff Roberts and his team, Drew, Sean & Nick steering the 1st Team. The season was to be curtailed due to Covid-19. The 2021/22 season looked more promising with the new FA restructuring of the leagues; the football club then began their journey together with Jeff and his team in the Hellenic League - Premier Division. With a new 1st Team manager, James Mapstone, taking over towards the end of 2022/2023 season which unfortunately ended in relegation from the Hellenic Premier Division.

The 2023/2024 in the Hellenic Division 1 season showed great promise with new players joining the squad, things were looking up for the team. Pre-season went very well winning games. The team were looking good! Football has a way of knocking you back; picked up injuries to key players and never recovered from a bad run of results. Half way through the season, players began to leave. It was at this time Kevin Ashwood (was Wicks manager) became available to join the club, working alongside James. Kevin, then brought along his assistants and an influx of players.

The team finished in the relegation zone; due to other movements within the NLS stayed up.

The 2024/25 season was in the end quite successful. The team had a new manager in Kevin Ashwood who assembled a very good crop of young but inexperienced players at this level. The team played some really good football but just couldn't get results that we probably deserved. There had been some turmoil within the management team and sadly Kevin resigned his post as manager. Jeff Roberts who had stepped in to help Kevin just before resigning took over the reins again after a two year gap. Jeff managed to pick up where Kevin left off and got results that managed to see the team climb up the table. Unfortunately, the players ran out of steam and finished 10th.

We look forward to the 2025/26 season.

For the rest of the club - The Reserves have a new manager, Tim Seymour, who is entrusted now to take the team to the Bristol Premier Combination League. The A team will have a name change to Development team with Will Theobald at the helm in Div 1 of the Bristol and District League. During this season Will stepped down due to a new job. This meant Mike Cunningham and Lee Rendle took over the role of joint managers.

Carterton FC - Club History



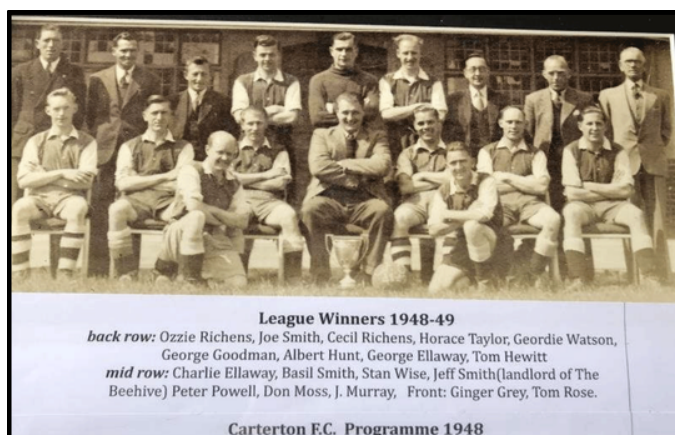
Carterton Football Club was founded in 1918 and initially played in the Witney & District League. They won the Premier Division title in 1960–61, 1965–66, 1976–77 and again 1984–85. The Club was Division One champions and won the Oxfordshire Junior Cup in 1985–86.

The Club then moved up to Division One of the Hellenic League and after winning Division One in 1989–90, they were promoted to the Premier Division. Carterton was relegated back to Division One at the end of the 1991–92 season but won the division again in 1993–94 and returned to the Premier Division. In 1998–99 the Club finished as Premier Division runners-up and went on to win the league's Supplementary Cup in 1999–2000 as well as the Challenge Cup in 2000–01. The Club remained in the Premier Division until being relegated to Division One West at the end of the 2010–11 season and won the league in 2015-16.

Carterton FC played in the Premier Division of the Witney & District League from 2019 until 2021 when they entered Division Two of the Hellenic League and then entered the Oxford Senior League Premier Division in 2022.

Most recently, Carterton FC won the Oxford Senior Premier Division season 2023-24 and made a double season running out winners of the Presidents Cup.

For season 2025-26, Carterton FC is part of the Hellenic League with the First Team in Division One and a Development Team in the Alliance League.

First Team Match Report

28/03/26 League v Ludlow Town – Away – 1-3

Cannings Hat-Trick Stuns Ludlow as Threadbare Sodbury Dig Deep

Chipping Sodbury Town travelled to Ludlow knowing it was always going to be a difficult afternoon. With players away on holiday, others sidelined through injury, and only the bare eleven available — plus the management team filling the bench — expectations were modest at best. The message was simple: dig in, stay together, and fight for every inch.

What unfolded in the opening quarter of an hour, though, was nothing short of astonishing.

In blustery, awkward conditions Sodbury opted for a more direct approach, looking to turn Ludlow early and play in the right areas. It didn't take long for that plan to pay off. In just his second appearance for the first team, **Callum Cannings** produced a blistering 15-minute hat-trick that completely blew the hosts away.

4th Minute – The Breakthrough

A quick move down the left saw **Kyle Head** whip a low cross into the box. Cannings arrived with perfect timing, guiding a composed left-footed finish into the bottom right corner. A calm strike in chaotic conditions.

8th Minute – Double Trouble

Sodbury kept pushing. Another delivery from the left found Cannings unmarked on the six-yard line. This time he rose above the defender and planted a firm header past the keeper. Two-nil, and Ludlow were reeling.

15th Minute – The Poacher's Touch

The third was all about instinct. A cross from the right caused panic in the Ludlow box, and Cannings reacted quickest, steering the ball into the bottom left corner to complete a stunning hat-trick. A dream start for the youngster, and a moment that silenced the home crowd.

What many expected to be a long, gruelling afternoon suddenly became a statement of character. Despite the depleted squad, every Sodbury player dug deep. They pressed, battled, covered every blade of grass, and refused to let Ludlow back into the contest. It was a performance built on adversity — and strengthened by it.

This was a day where the badge meant everything. A day where eleven players, stretched to their limits, stood tall together. And a day where a young striker announced himself in unforgettable fashion.

Second Half: Digging Deep Against the Wind

The first half flew by, but Sodbury knew the second would be a different challenge entirely. Now playing into the wind, every clearance, every header, every second ball mattered.

The back line stood tall, with **Billy Thomas** commanding the box superbly. He slowed the game down when needed, organised those around him, and set the tone for a disciplined defensive display.

Ludlow pushed harder as the half wore on, using the wind to their advantage. It wasn't until the closing stages that they finally broke through — a wind-assisted cross to the far post caused a scramble, and the loose ball was eventually poked home.

But Sodbury didn't panic. They regrouped, tightened up, and saw out the final minutes with grit and determination.

A difficult trip turned into a memorable victory. Sodbury showed heart, unity, and belief — and earned every bit of it.

Reserve Team Match Report

28/03/26 League v Old Sudbury – Away – 8-0

Chipping Sodbury Reserves were on the receiving end of a humbling 8-0 defeat away to local rivals Old Sodbury on Saturday.

A much depleted Sods side went into the game without seven regular starters through a combination of injury, unavailability and first team call ups so it was always going to be a tough task facing a team recruiting from Hellenic/Toolstation level, but The Sods would still have hoped for a less comprehensive scoreline.

The Sods started brightly and had a chance to open the scoring when winger Ethan Roberts broke down the left hand side before carving out a chance for Liam Barrett who saw his effort saved. Old Sodbury immediately countered and goalkeeper James Dobson was forced into a good save from an attempted chip.

The home side began to take control and The Sods had Sam Jarman to thank after the leftback twice cleared off the line from a 10th minute corner.

Old Sodbury took a 15th minute lead after beating the offside trap before the ball was squared across goal leading to rightback Jacob Owers scoring an unfortunate own goal. The lead was doubled only five minutes later when a free-kick could only be cleared to the edge of the box before being finished.

The Sods were left frustrated on the half hour mark when striker Liam Barrett was wrestled to the ground inside the box with the referee somehow not awarding the spot-kick. Then seven minutes before the break Sam Jarman again cleared off the line from another corner.

With limited options on the bench to change the game Manager Nick Trutch changed to a 4-4-2 formation at halftime with Max Shephard coming into an unfamiliar right wing position allowing Luke Corbiere to join Liam Barrett up front. Sadly the change didn't have the desired effect and it only took Old Sodbury seven minutes to make it 3-0 when a low free-kick into the box was finished by an unmarked attacker.


The home side made it 4-0 on 66 minutes when James Dobson couldn't keep hold of an effort with the rebound being prodded home. Then with 15 minutes remaining the offside trap was broken again and the cross tapped in to make it 5-0.

The Sods looked as though they were hoping to hear the final whistle as the game entered the closing stages and the final three goals added to the misery, the first coming with 8 minutes remaining when the offside was broke again before the Old Sodbury striker dinked the ball over James Dobson.

With 3 minutes of normal time remaining Old Sodbury made it 7-0 from the penalty spot after defender Alex Fox had brought down the winger inside the box, then the 8th was scored in stoppage time when a rebound was tapped home.

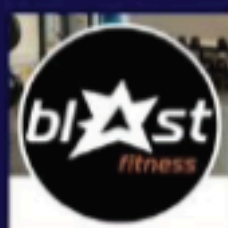
