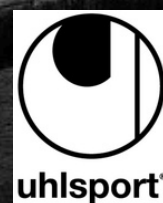

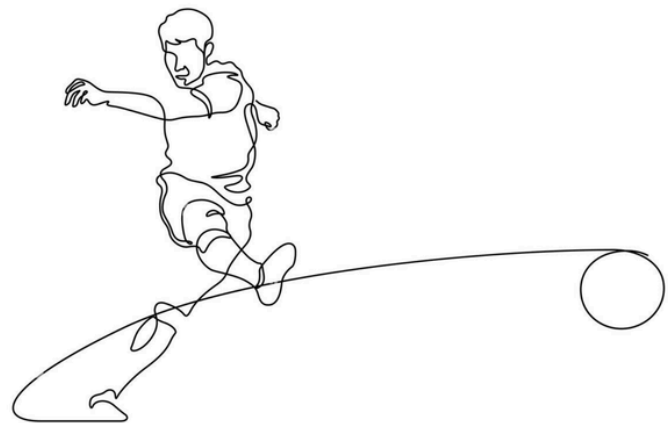

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken:

I MAY BE:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league or CFA Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents.

IN ADDITION:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club.

CSFC History



In the summer of 1959 Cliff Phelps decided it was time football association was brought back to the town. It had been six long years since the boys of the town had donned the Blue & White of Sodbury in the Western League. After several meetings at The Bell Inn (Now Brooks Bar & Kitchen) the new club was formed. Major L.M.Harris was President, Mr. E Purbrick Chairman, Mr. C Phelps Vice Chairman, Club Captain Dennis Greenaway and Youth Captain Michael Boulton. In the initial 1959/60 season they entered a senior team into The Dursley & Wotton League and a team into the Youth Section. The following season Sodbury joined the Bristol and District League and throughout the 60's remained in Division 3.

The 1970's began with relegation, when we finished bottom of Division 3 and the slump continued in 1971/72 Season when finishing bottom of Division 4. The Mid 70's saw a few changes and the ground work of the team today. Mike Fox became player Manager and 'The Sods' began a Sunday Side. In the 1976/77 Season, Sodbury finished third in Division 5 and gained promotion. The 1978/79 Season saw us go one better and finished runners-up of Division 4. To finish the decade off and celebrate twenty years of the club's rebirth, we won the Championship of Division 3 in 1979/80.

The 1980's began were the 70's left off and a fourth place finish gave Sodbury promotion to Bristol and District Division 1. 1981/82 saw the rebirth of our Reserve side and by the end of the season, the 1st's had gained promotion to the Senior Division. From Division 5, to the Senior League in six seasons. The first season in the Senior division was mid-table finish and the end of the season saw Mike Fox's testimonial and an Ashton Gate appearance against Mangotsfield united. The following season we finished third. After finishing 15th in 1985/86 we were relegated to Division 1, where we remained until finishing runners up in 1988/89.

The 1990's kicked off with a third place finish and promotion to the Bristol Premier Combination Div 1. in 1990/91. The early 90's saw a new clubhouse and changing rooms built with Players and Committee members contributing their trades. A fourth place finish and the winning of the Premier cup in 1992/93 was the clubs best season so far. The Sods remained in Division 1 until the end of the nineties, when they were promoted to the Premier Division for the 1999/00 Season.

The 2000's and after 3 seasons in the Premier, the Sods were relegated at the end of 2001/02 season. A new manager and new era began in 2002/03. Les Underdown and his Assistant Jeff Clark both ex-players with the club took over the reins. A mid table finish in their first season, saw Les leave and left Jeff in the hot seat. The following season saw another mid-table

finish and the Reserves become Champions with the exciting players now in the squad. 2004/05 ended in a disappointing third place but the club now had a third team as well. The following season, the previous year was forgotten when the club won the Championship and promoted back to the Premier division.

A mid table finish in the Premier division and the other 2 teams both winning promotion was a good season in 2006/07. 2007/08 became the clubs most successful season, when the first's won the Championship of the Premier and the reserves Champions of Bristol & District division 1. The first season and a change of manager in the Gloucestershire county league and the team finished bottom of the league, only winning 5 games. Even though the club finished bottom, they were not relegated. Mark Stenner was appointed manager and he started the steady march up the County league.

The 2010's has produced the club's most successful time in their history. Mark Stenner had taken the team to a third place finish in the County league in 2010/11. After his departure early the following season, Scott Gibson took over. A disappointing bottom place finish was followed by two seasons of rebuilding and climbing the league. Karl Reese was appointed new manager at the beginning of 2014/15 season and in his first season had promoted the club from the County league to the dizzy heights of Western League football with a third place finish. Not a bad start for the new gaffer but with some new faces and playing great football, we went 1 better the following season and won the Western League Division 1 Championship. 2016/17 and the Western League Premier division was tough but a very creditable 13th position and competing in the F.A.Vase was our most successful season so far.

2017/18 was going to be a massive mountain to climb. Karl had left the club and also half the first team had departed to pastures new. Enter Neil Simons our new gaffer, a season in the Western league to take on with half a team and to make things a little more difficult, your first game is the clubs first ever game in the F.A.Cup. The season ended with a 13th place finish, an FA Cup victory and a quarter final place in the GFA Challenge trophy.

Early in the 2018/19 Season Neil decided to leave the club and shortly afterwards we appointed our present manager Joe White and his assistant Steve. At the end of the season under his leadership, the club had finished 10th in the Western League and had the best run in the FA cup in the clubs history. The club were successful in their appeal against the Hellenic League, sideways move by the F.A. So 2019/20 season was in the Western League Premier. The uncertainty of which League we would be playing in unsettled the players and so several departed the Club before a ball was kicked that Season. Three weeks before the season started the club also lost our Manager and his Assistant. Justin Bishop & Scott Gibson took control of the 1st team as Caretaker management and remained there until the League came to an abrupt halt. The F.A. announced on 26th March 2020 that the Step 1-7 game and all grassroots football leagues and competition under its umbrella had ended,

as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic. All results for the season would be expunged.

The 2020's began with Jeff Roberts and his team, Drew, Sean & Nick steering the 1st Team. The season was to be curtailed due to Covid-19. The 2021/22 season looked more promising with the new FA restructuring of the leagues; the football club then began their journey together with Jeff and his team in the Hellenic League - Premier Division. With a new 1st Team manager, James Mapstone, taking over towards the end of 2022/2023 season which unfortunately ended in relegation from the Hellenic Premier Division.

The 2023/2024 in the Hellenic Division 1 season showed great promise with new players joining the squad, things were looking up for the team. Pre-season went very well winning games. The team were looking good! Football has a way of knocking you back; picked up injuries to key players and never recovered from a bad run of results. Half way through the season, players began to leave. It was at this time Kevin Ashwood (was Wicks manager) became available to join the club, working alongside James. Kevin, then brought along his assistants and an influx of players.

The team finished in the relegation zone; due to other movements within the NLS stayed up.

The 2024/25 season was in the end quite successful. The team had a new manager in Kevin Ashwood who assembled a very good crop of young but inexperienced players at this level. The team played some really good football but just couldn't get results that we probably deserved. There had been some turmoil within the management team and sadly Kevin resigned his post as manager. Jeff Roberts who had stepped in to help Kevin just before resigning took over the reins again after a two year gap. Jeff managed to pick up where Kevin left off and got results that managed to see the team climb up the table. Unfortunately, the players ran out of steam and finished 10th.

We look forward to the 2025/26 season.

For the rest of the club - The Reserves have a new manager, Tim Seymour, who is entrusted now to take the team to the Bristol Premier Combination League. The A team will have a name change to Development team with Will Theobald at the helm in Div 1 of the Bristol and District League. During this season Will stepped down due to a new job. This meant Mike Cunningham and Lee Rendle took over the role of joint managers.

Clanfield 85 - Club History

Clanfield Football Club was founded in 1890 and for many years played in the Witney & District League. Two years were spent in the North Berks League in the 1960's and for 1967-68 season the club joined the Hellenic League.

Clanfield's first game in the Hellenic League was on the 19th August 1967 against Hungerford Town in front of an attendance of 146. In 1969-70 the club won the Hellenic Division One Championship and were promoted to the Premier Division for the first time.

In 1971-72 they missed out on the Runners-Up position only on goal average but went on to secure the Runner Up spot for the next two seasons also winning the Premier Division Challenge Cup in 1973-74. In 1974-75 the Club reached the Final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup. The first game ended in a draw after extra time, but Pressed Steel won the replay. 1975-76 saw a repeat of the Cup run to the Final but again Clanfield ended up losing Finalists. After a great period through the 60s and 70s they were relegated to Division One at the end of the 1979-80 Season. However, the Club soon bounced back finishing in second place the following season. At the end of the 1984-85 Season they were once again relegated to Division One where they have remained ever since.

The Club re-entered the FA Vase in 2006 when Buckingham Athletic were visitors to Radcot Road, in a game Clanfield won 1-0. The club won the Jim Newman Memorial Cup in 1978 & 2018 and have been finalists in recent staging of the same event and won the Faringdon Memorial Cup in 1996-97 and 2016-17. Season 2010- 11 saw the club finish in fourth place in Division One West and narrowly miss out on promotion to the Premier Division.

The Club have recently adopted a positive youth policy. The Under 18 Team have won the Allied Counties Youth League Central Division and last season their County Cup Competition. The previous season, 2016-17 the Under 17 Team won the Oxfordshire Invitation Youth League Division B whilst the Under 16 Team won their County Cup Competition.

For the 2020-21 season former player Jamie Butt alongside Chris Blakley and Martin Staddon continued as the first team management, with Gary Brown joining them. The season was looking very positive but again was curtailed by the Corona Virus Pandemic.

There was a management restructure for the 2021-22 season with Andy Lyne joining the club as the first Director of Football. Chris Blakely and Martin Staddon stood down from their First Team commitment and the club thanks them both for all their effort over their time with Jamie. Following a nasty injury whilst playing elsewhere, Jordi Mulvany returned to the club as First Team Coach. The season was a success for the club as Clanfield finished third in Division One, losing out in the semi final to Hereford Pegasus who went on to secure

promotion in the final against Worcester Raiders. They were also losing semi-finalists in the Challenge Cup as they went out 1-0 to the eventual winners Cribbs FC.

For the 2022-23 season Craig Connor has stepped into the First Team Assistant role after deciding to step away from the rigours of playing, and the club wishes him every success in his new role.

The club have enjoyed success in the pre-season retaining the Jim Newman Trophy and winning it for the third time in recent years beating Cropredy 8-1 in the final.

The Chairman and Committee at Clanfield 85 FC wish them every success in the campaign ahead.

Match Report - First Team

28/02/26 League Thame v Chipping Sodbury – Away – 2-3

Sodbury's trip to Thame brought not just another league fixture, but a test of character after three tough weeks on the road and three straight defeats. What they delivered was a performance built on resilience, sharper intent, and a refusal to let another opportunity slip away.

Sodbury began tentatively, the recent run clearly weighing on them. Passes were cautious, touches a little heavy, and confidence still fragile. Yet on 24 minutes they struck first. A well-worked move down the right exposed Thame's defence, leaving Tyler Dacres unmarked inside the box. He reacted quickest, firing home from close range to give Sodbury a much-needed lift.

The lead, however, didn't last long. Four minutes later a miscued cross from Thame's right winger ballooned awkwardly over keeper Billy Thomas. With the defence unable to clear the looping ball at the far post, an onrushing Thame forward pounced to level the score.

The half became a scrap from there—plenty of effort, little rhythm. Just before the break, a nasty clash of heads between the Thame goalkeeper and a defender halted play for several minutes as both players were bandaged up. The stoppage drained the momentum from the game, and the sides went in at 1–1, neither fully satisfied.

Manager Jeff Roberts clearly found the right words at half-time. Sodbury emerged with renewed purpose, pressing higher, moving the ball quicker, and showing the fight that had been missing in recent weeks.

Their reward came swiftly. On 52 minutes, a Keane Ashwood corner was met at the far post by Toby Allsopp-Jones, whose looping header arced over the keeper and dropped into the net to restore the lead. Five minutes later, Sodbury struck again. Another incisive move down Thame's right saw Tyler Dacres turn provider, whipping a low cross into the box. Josh Pandolfino reacted fastest, sliding in to guide the ball under the keeper for 3–1. Thame's heads dropped; Sodbury's confidence surged.

From there, the visitors controlled the game, moving the ball with assurance and limiting Thame to hopeful breaks. The only scare came on 85 minutes when a soft free-kick, 25 yards out and central, was curled around the wall and into the bottom corner to make it 3–2. But Sodbury held firm through the final minutes, showing the composure that had deserted them in recent weeks.

A deserved and hard-earned victory. After a difficult February, Sodbury rediscovered their edge: sharper in attack, more determined in the duels, and far more confident once they regained control of the match. The response after half-time was exactly what Roberts would have wanted.

Match Report - Reserves

28/02/26 League Chipping Sodbury Reserves v Hanham – Home – 7-0

Chipping Sodbury Reserves cruised to a convincing 7-0 victory over Hanham Athletic Reserves on Saturday with the help of a hat-trick from debutant Callum Cannings. The game nearly didn't go ahead with concerns over the condition of the pitch, but after some care and attention the fixture went ahead.

The game was a one-sided affair from start to finish and there was a flurry of chances inside the first ten minutes with wingers Josh Bell and Callum Cannings both going close and striker Jordan Hickman forcing a save from the edge of the box and bending an effort just past the far post. The deadlock was broken on 12 minutes with Josh Bell using his pace to get to the byline before cutting back to allow midfielder Ben Rankin to hammer home the opener. Rankin would go close to doubling the scoreline just one minute later but saw his cushioned volley sail over the bar.

The Sods didn't have to wait too long for the second goal however when a long ball upfield from centreback Liam Barrett found Callum Cannings who produced a cheeky finish over the 'keeper on 14 minutes.

Midway through the first half Josh Bell struck the outside of the post after getting in behind, then the five minutes that followed left both teams frustrated to say the least. Firstly Hanham were incensed after their striker was pulled back by defender Luke Henderson just outside the box with the referee showing a yellow card even though there was a case that he was the last defender and prevented a goal scoring opportunity, luckily James Dobson was on hand to produce a double save. Then not long afterwards it was The Sods that were left baffled when a ball was put through to Josh Bell who lifted his effort over the oncoming goalkeeper to seemingly make it 3-0. But, just as the ball was crossing the line the referee inexplicably blew to call it back for a free-kick.... to The Sods!

There were two more chances for The Sods to extend the lead before halftime that came and went, firstly Liam Barrett heading a corner over the crossbar, then Ben Rankin firing wide. Following the start of the second half it only took 3 minutes for The Sods to make it 3-0 with Callum Cannings stealing possession before releasing Josh Bell who at first looked like he'd taken the ball too wide but still managed to find the finish from a tight angle.

It was 4-0 with 53 minutes played after midfielder Russ Stone won possession before finding striker Jordan Hickman on the left hand side of the box, Hickman cutting inside and placing into the far bottom corner, a goal his performance fully deserved.

The only sour point for The Sods came on the hour mark when the lively Josh Bell went down clutching his hamstring with confirmation of a tear coming later in the evening, ruling him out for several weeks.

The Sods made it 5-0 on 66 minutes after great work from makeshift rightback Ethan Roberts who won the ball before carrying up field and finding substitute winger Jamie Bradford who found a very composed finish.

Match Report - Reserves

As the game entered the final six minutes winger Adam Perks, who added energy from the bench, set up Callum Cannings to double his tally with a cheeky overhead kick that caught the goalkeeper off-guard. Only two minutes later and Cannings sealed his debut hat-trick after Adam Perks latched onto a loose backpass before squaring for Cannings to make it 7-0.

In the dying seconds Jordan Hickman forced the Hanham 'keeper into a double save before the referee blew for full-time.

With so many goals and assists on display it was actually midfielder Mike England who walked away with the players' Man of the Match award, the captains' contributions in the middle of the park rightly being recognised by his teammates. Callum Cannings picked up the managers award after a fantastic debut.

The Sods continue to hunt down the rest of the pack in the race for promotion with all eyes on other results.

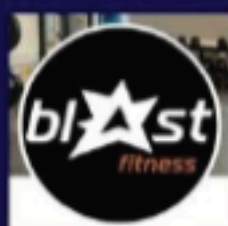
