CHIPPING SODBURY TOWN HISTORY

In the summer of 1959 Cliff Phelps decided it was time football association was brought back to the town. It had been six long years since the boys of the town had donned the Blue & White of Sodbury in the Western League. After several meetings at The Bell Inn (Now Brooks Bar & Kitchen) the new club was formed. Major L.M.Harris was President, Mr. E Purbrick Chairman, Mr. C Phelps Vice Chairman, Club Captain Dennis Greenaway and Youth Captain Michael Boulton. In the initial 1959/60 season they entered a senior team into The Dursley & Wotton League and a team into the Youth Section. The following season Sodbury joined the Bristol and District League and throughout the 60's remained in Division 3.

The 1970's began with relegation, when we finished bottom of Division 3 and the slump continued in 1971/72 Season when finishing bottom of Division 4. The Mid 70's saw a few changes and the ground work of the team today. Mike Fox became player Manager and 'The Sods' began a Sunday Side. In the 1976/77 Season, Sodbury finished third in Division 5 and gained promotion. The 1978/79 Season saw us go one better and finished runners-up of Division 4. To finish the decade off and celebrate twenty years of the club's rebirth, we won the Championship of Division 3 in 1979/80.

The 1980's began were the 70's left off and a fourth place finish gave Sodbury promotion to Bristol and District Division 1. 1981/82 saw the rebirth of our Reserve side and by the end of the season, the 1st's had gained promotion to the Senior Division. From Division 5, to the Senior League in six seasons. The first season in the Senior division was mid-table finish and the end of the season saw Mike Fox's testimonial and an Ashton Gate appearance against Mangotsfield united. The following season we finished third. After finishing 15th in 1985/86 we were relegated to Division 1, where we remained until finishing runners up in 1988/89.

The 1990's kicked off with a third place finish and promotion to the Bristol Premier Combination Div 1. in 1990/91. The early 90's saw a new clubhouse and changing rooms built with Players and Committee members contributing their trades. A fourth place finish and the winning of the Premier cup in 1992/93 was the clubs best season so far. The Sods remained in Division 1 until the end of the nineties, when they were promoted to the Premier Division for the 1999/00 Season.

The 2000's and after 3 seasons in the Premier, the Sods were relegated at the end of 2001/02 season. A new manager and new era began in 2002/03. Les Underdown and his Assistant Jeff Clark both ex-players with the club took over the reins. A mid table finish in their first season, saw Les leave and left Jeff in the hot seat. The following season saw another mid-table finish and the Reserves become Champions with the exciting players now in the squad. 2004/05 ended in a disappointing third place but the club now had a third team as well. The following season, the previous year was forgotten when the club won the Championship and promoted back to the Premier division. A mid table finish in the Premier division and the other 2 teams both winning promotion was a good season in 2006/07. 2007/08 became the clubs most successful season, when the first's won the Championship of the Premier and the reserves Champions of Bristol & District division 1. The first season and a change of manager in the Gloucestershire county league and the team finished bottom of the league, only winning 5 games. Even though the club finished bottom, they were not relegated. Mark Stenner was appointed manager and he started the steady march up the County league.

The 2010's has produced the club's most successful time in their history. Mark Stenner had taken the team to a third place finish in the County league in 2010/11. After his departure early the following season, Scott Gibson took over. A disappointing bottom place finish was followed by two seasons of rebuilding and climbing the league. Karl Reese was appointed new manager at the beginning of 2014/15 season and in his first season had promoted the club from the County league to the dizzy heights of Western League football with a third place finish. Not a bad start for the new gaffer but with some new faces and playing great football, we went 1 better the following season and won the Western League Division 1 Championship. 2016/17 and the Western League Premier division was tough but a very creditable 13th position and competing in the F.A.Vase was our most successful season so far. 2017/18 was going to be a massive mountain to climb. Karl had left the club and also half the first team had departed to pastures new. Enter Neil Simons our new gaffer, a season in the Western league to take on with half a team and to make things a little more difficult, your first game is the clubs first ever game in the F.A.Cup. The season ended with a 13th place finish, an FA Cup victory and a quarter final place in the GFA Challenge trophy. Early in the 2018/19 Season Neil decided to leave the club and shortly afterwards we appointed our present manager Joe White and his assistant Steve. At the end of the season under his leadership, the club had finished 10th in the Western League and had the best run in the FA cup in the clubs history. The club were successful in their appeal against the Hellenic League, sideways move by the F.A. So 2019/20 season was in the Western League Premier. The uncertainty of which League we would be playing in, unsettled the players and so several departed the Club before a ball was kicked that Season. Three weeks before the season started the club also lost our Manager and his Assistant. Justin Bishop & Scott Gibson took control of the 1st team as Caretaker management and remained there until the League came to an abrupt halt. The F.A. announced on 26th March 2020 that the Step 1-7 game and all grassroots football leagues and competition under its umbrella had ended, as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic. All results for the season would be expunged.

The 2020's began with Jeff Roberts and his team, Drew, Sean & Nick steering the 1st Team. The season was to be curtailed due to Covid-19. The 2021/22 season looked more promising with the new FA restructuring of the leagues; the football club then began their journey together with Jeff and his team in the Hellenic League - Premier Division. With a new 1st Team manager, James Mapstone, taking over towards the end of 2022/2023 season we are looking forward to exciting times for the club and who knows where it will end!

For the rest of the club - The Reserves have a new manager, Tim Seymour, who is entrusted now to take the team to the Bristol Premier Combination League. Will Theobald is the Manager to take our A Team forward in the Bristol and District League.

The Committee have worked tirelessly over the break to update and move forward the club. We are all volunteers and always welcome more people to join this fantastic club.

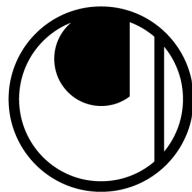

11 minutes In & Sodbury have a Free kick 25 yards from goal but Owen Lingard shoots just wide. Both teams attack with purpose through the first half but Sodbury have the better of the chances & also force 7 first half corners.

As the half draws to a close both teams have great opportunities to score but the half finishes 1-0 to the home side.

2nd half

End to end start to the half & Sodbury equalise in the 75th minute, a great free kick from Keane Ashwood is parried by the keeper & Callum Ball reacts quickest to score 1-1.

As Sodbury start to tire with the 10 men the home side take the lead on 87 minutes with a counter attack 2-1. Tytherington have another chance to score late on but the sodbury keeper raced off his line to clear.

FC STRATFORD HISTORY



Club History

FC Stratford - originally known as Stratford Town A, joined the Midland Combination League ahead of the 2009/10 season.

A strong first season in Division Three led to a fifth-placed finish out of sixteen sides. FC also just missed out on a Challenge Urn final spot following an agonising 6:5 defeat to Blackwood over two legs.

FC would however suffer second season syndrome in 2010/11, finishing a lowly tenth out of fourteen sides.

Despite a poor league season, FC were to go one better in the Challenge Urn by reaching the Final against Aston at Pilkington XXX. An even final finishing 2:2 was decided by penalties. FC secured the Challenge Urn with a 4-1 penalty shoot-out victory.

At the end of the 2010/11 season, Division Three of the Midland Combination was disbanded and sides were placed into Division Two.

Stratford Town A also changed their name to FC Stratford.

Over the next couple of seasons, FC achieved mid-table finishes in Division Two.



However, the 2013/14 season proved a real challenge for FC. Manager Pete Stephens struggled to field a side most weeks culminating in the club finishing fourteenth in the sixteen side league.

During the Summer of 2014, the Midland Combination joined forces with the Midland Alliance to form the Midland Football League (MFL). FC remained in the lowest division, Division Three.

The 2014/15 season proved to be much like the previous one. Each week continued to be a struggle and FC finished twelfth of fifteen teams.

However, the following season saw the tide begin to turn for FC. A strong start saw the club become one of the favourites for promotion. Unfortunately a mid-season blip saw FC lose touch but nevertheless, FC finished a well-placed fourth.

In the cup competitions, FC were to experience semi-final heartache twice: a 2:0 defeat in

the Coventry Evening Telegraph Cup against Woodlands WMC, and a 3:0 defeat in the Smedley Croke Memorial Charity Cup against Chelmsley Town.

Overall, the season had seen FC make really good progress and had certainly been their best so far.

The 2016/17 season saw Pete Stephens move 'upstairs' with the appointment of former Alcester Town Manager, Dave Poulson as boss.

With Division Three now containing some strong teams, FC had their work cut out to match their previous season. After a good start, FC finished sixth out of fourteen teams.

FC did enjoy another good cup run though, this time reaching the Les James Challenge Cup Final at Walsall's Bescot Stadium, following a semi-final penalty shoot-out victory over local rivals Redditch Borough. Unfortunately, FC were swiftly removed from the competition after inadvertently fielding a cup-tied player.

Dave Poulson's new signings helped FC get the 2017/18 season off to a flyer. Despite a dip in form, FC finished third in a tough league won by GNP Sports.

FC's goal difference proved enough to see Poulson's side slip his former club Alcester Town to earn promotion into MFL Division Two (step 7).

With his objective complete, and a new business venture in the pipeline, Poulson handed over to highly-rated Nick Ballinger to take charge of FC's inaugural season in MFL Two.

A player overhaul saw Ballinger introduce several of his Midland Floodlit Youth League Cup winners to the MFL.

Although a tough campaign, Ballinger's side achieved their aim, with a third from bottom finish ensuring their survival.

The season witnessed FC make their debut in the FA Vase. In a tight match, FC paid the price for a missed penalty, losing 1:0 to Bewdley Town.

Furthermore, FC also reached the President's Cup Final where they suffered a narrow 3:2 defeat to League runners-up GNP Sports - a super achievement.

Ahead of the 2019/20 season, Ballinger stepped away from FC to spend more time with his family. Dave Poulson resumed charge of First Team affairs.

Poulson's side lost their opening two games before mounting a serious challenge for promotion.

A first win in the Vase over Chelmsley Town saw FC progress, only to lose to arch rivals GNP Sports, this time on

penalties. Unfortunately, the season was ended in March 2020 by COVID-19.

FC player Danny Janes was installed as Manager for the 2020/21 season, with Dave Poulson becoming Chairman.

However, the season barely got started before COVID-19 again halted proceedings.

Following the National League System restructure, FC were transferred to Hellenic League Division One (HL1) - a move from step 7 to step 6 of the football non-league pyramid.

The new 2021/22 season also saw FC move away from playing at Stratford Town's ground to The Home Guard Club, just down the road.

Janes' team got off to a great start, topping the table after the first ten games. A slump in form, coupled with Janes' November move to Pershore Town and the subsequent exodus of players, resulted in FC's slide down the table.

Easter Ground-hop

Chairman Dave Poulson stepped back into the hotseat as caretaker boss: Poulson re-organised the squad and having navigated a tricky time, restored stability to the club.

In January 2022, Ian Cooksey (assisted by Neil Chaundy) was appointed Manager.

Notable results against teams [to be promoted] Hereford Pegasus and Worcester Raiders helped FC eventually finish a creditable eighth in HL1. FC's last home game was designated part of the Easter Ground-hop weekend.

Jon Hill became Manager of FC for the 2022/23 season. Steve Sykes became Chairman and FC returned to the Arden Garages Stadium. Hill's young team proceeded to play attractive football as well as compete physically.

An unbeaten run of ten games catapulted FC towards the Play-off zone. After eventually clearing a backlog of fixtures, FC clinched fifth place and a Play-off place - their highest finish in the football pyramid.



County Cup Winners

The hectic season-end run of games caught up with the FC players in the Play-off semi-final as FC lost 4:0 to Hartpury University.

However two weeks later, a refreshed FC squad enjoyed an emphatic 5:0 victory in the Birmingham County FA Midweek Floodlit Cup Final at Walsall's Bescot Stadium. An incredible first-half saw FC net five goals to blow opponents Wednesday away, sparking wonderful celebrations both on and off the pitch.

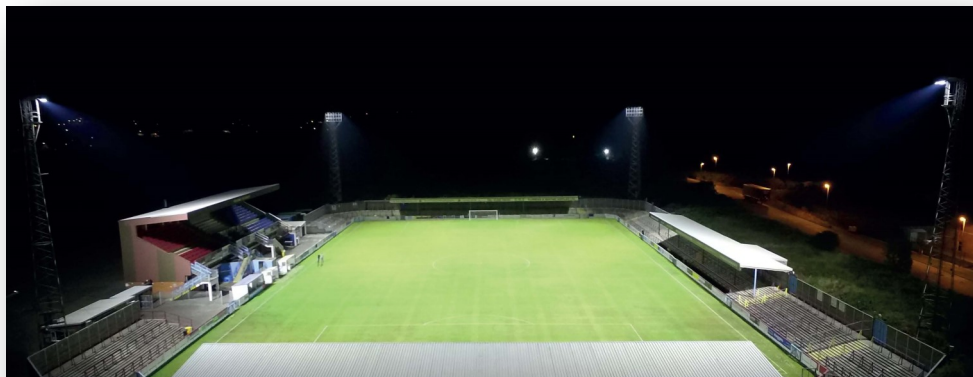

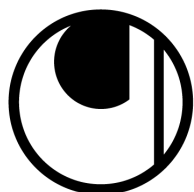
